

Capri



The island of Capri is situated in the Gulf of Naples, between the Italian Peninsula and the islands of Procida and Ischia. Made of limestone, its lowest part is at the center, while its sides are high and mostly surrounded by steep precipices, which contain numerous caves. Its topography is dominated by the slopes of the Solaro Mount on the West and St. Michele Mont in the East.

The name of the island derives from the name of its oldest Italic inhabitants - known to the Greeksas Kaprie and Kapréai and to the Romans as Capreae. Linguistic analysis refutes the Greek origin of the place name and considers the name "Capri" to derive from the language of the ancient Italic populations who settled in the area of the Gulf of Naples. The name makes reference to the goats (capre) which formed a characteristic aspect of the island landscape while identifying an important feature of the economy of the non-Greek community - goat farming, one of the few possible means of sustenance in an area with no space for crop cultivation and frequent water shortages. The poet Homer describes the island in the Odyssea, where Capri wearing the robes of the mythical mermaid enchantress from the wonderful and mysterious song. This appears still today Capri to the eye of travelers, it stands as a rock lost in the cobalt blue sea. The scent of flowers, the lively but composed contrasting colors, the reminiscent of a past that is lost in myth, La Canzone del Mare that changes silence in melody are just some of the ingredients of the caprese story. Capri is a world unto itself forever. Who gets there, he warns to be suddenly in front of the masterpiece of nature, a show of harmonious joy that triumphs in the soul, heart and mind. It is a Mediterranean island celebrated and exalted in the most famous lyrics. The first who discover it was Caesar Augustus in 29 BC, he loves the island and removed it from the domain of the city of Naples and baptized it with the name: Apragopoli, "la città del dolce far niente" (pleasant idleness). Also Tiberius decided to live on the island in the last years of his life and he built twelve luxury residences dedicated to the gods of Olympus, choosing for himself, the thirteenth, Villa Jovis, a sumptuous and impregnable palace overlooking the sea, from where, it is said, that the sovereign, taciturn and suspicious, threw without thinking, who did not like, friends or foes. Since then the island alive, and almost feeds of myths, legends and scandals.

Best places to visit

There is so much to see - from the colorful port of Marina Grande to the glamorous Piazzetta where the world's beautiful people hang out; from the ruins of Emperor Tiberius' villas to the Charterhouse of San Giacomo and the spectacular Via Krupp. You can take the chair lift to the top of Solaro Mount. You can walk along paths leading to incredible rock formations such as the Natural Arch and the Faraglioni. You can marvel at the glimmering blue of the Grotta Azzurra and you can fall in love with Capri just like hundreds and thousands of visitors before you.

- 1) Natural Arch- Cave of Matermania-Pizzolungo-Tragara, a walk between
- 2) Villa Jovis, the most magnificent of all Emperior Tiberius' island residences.
- 3) Augustus Garden Via Krupp, panoramic gardens and an incredible feat of engineering.
- 4) Charterhouse of St. Giacomo, the 14th century masterpiece in the heart of Capri.
- 5) Grotta Azzurra, Tiberius' water-filled nymphaeum, Capri's Blue Grotto.
- 6) Solaro Mount, the Island at your feet.
- 7) Villa San Michele, the marvelous museum in Axel Munthe's dream home, in Anacapri.
- 8) Villa Damecuta, the fascinating remains of Emperor Tiberius' residence in Anacapri.
- 9) San Michele church, with the majolica floor mosaic called "The Garden of Eden" in Anacapri.
- 10) Piazzetta, it may be small, but it's the most fashionable square in the world.
